The 20th Ponce de Leon ~The 4th International Matches~ April 9-11, 2022

This tournament is a 2 team contest:

TEAM UNITED STATES versus TEAM GREAT BRITAIN.

USA has 20 golfers. GREAT BRITAIN has 20 golfers.

All 40 golfers will play 4 tournament rounds, and all matches count for the competition (unlike the Ryder Cup, there are no golfers who "sit out" for any rounds).

There will be 50 matches total contested – all of which are "Match-Play":

The Matches consist of: 10 Foursome Matches on Saturday morning at Cougar Point;10 FourBall Matches on Saturday afternoon at Turtle Point; 10 FourBall Matches on Sunday at the Ocean Course; and 20 Singles Matches on Monday at Yeamans Hall Club.

USGA Rules govern play, unless otherwise stated. Range-finding/measurement devices are permitted during competitive play. Green-reading books are not permitted.

Each golfer's respective handicap has been adjusted equitably according to the slope and rating of each course, and will be reflected on the round's particular scorecard – and "dotted" accordingly. Unless otherwise stated, the strokes will be dotted off the lowest handicapper in that particular match.

The winner of each match scores ONE POINT for their respective team and country. In the event of a tied match, the points are halved.

The Team who attains at least 25.5 points will win the Matches, and thus the Helmet (with the losing team buying the Champions Dinner). In the event of a tie (25-25), Great Britain will retain the Helmet. However, for purposes of deciding the Champions Dinner wager if the final score is 25-25, the Team Captains shall appoint 4 golfers from their respective teams to participate in an impromptu sudden-death 8-man scramble immediately following competitive play, commencing on the Par 4 Tenth Hole at Yeamans Hall, and will continue to the next hole(s) until one team beats the other on a particular hole – no strokes involved... old-fashioned captains choice / scramble to break that dinner bet tie.

Singles Matchup Selection Process: After the Ocean Course round, 30 points will have been awarded and 20 are up for grabs in Singles.

Captains Spry and Morton will select the pairings for the Monday Singles matches using the following format. The purpose of the format is to give the team that is losing an opportunity to choose as many favorable matchups as possible. Chairman Emeritus Thomson will run the process.

If the score of the team match is:

15-15 to 16-14: Both teams will slot 10 and match 10 players. Procedure: If the match is tied, there will be a coin flip. (If not, Winning team will slot first two players) The loser of the coin flip will slot his first two players. Winner slots 2 then matches 2 players. This snaking process repeats until 40 players have been matched.

16.5-13.5 to 18-12: The losing team will match 12 players (slotting only 8) and the winning team will match 8 (thus, slotting 12).

18.5-11.5 to 20-10: The losing team will match 14 players (slotting only 6) and the winning team will match 6 (thus, slotting 14). Procedure: similar to the above, but larger final slot for winning team.

20.5-9.5 to 23.5-6.5: The losing team will match 16 players (slotting only 4) and the winning team will match 4 (thus, slotting 16). Procedure: similar to the above, but larger final slot for winning team.

24-6 or greater margin: Procedure: The winning Captain will slot all 20 players (matching zero) and the losing Captain will match all pairings (slotting zero).

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- **1. Q:** Golf Attire, generally?
 - A: Shorts permitted at each course.
- 2. Q: When do I wear my 2022 Ponce kit?
 A: Vest any round.
 Shirt Sunday Ocean required (team photos).
- 3. Q: Team colors, primarily?
 A: US: Blue and white
 GB: Red/pink and white
- **4. Q:** Walking, caddies, or riding?
 - A: Cougar and Turtle: riding carts (with teammates). Ocean: walking with caddie Yeamans: no caddies, but walking recommended. Easy walk. Golf carts available; push carts available
- **5. Q:** Breakfasts each day?
 - A: Sat, Sun & Mon: Jasmine's Porch (in Sanctuary lobby) opens at 6:30am. Very hearty. Room service available to Sanctuary guests as well; I think Villa guests should plan for Jasmine's Porch (do not rely on hearty breakfast-specific options at the courses themselves).

Tues: Yeamans will have great breakfast (7:30am-9:30am) prior to your departure to the airport.

- 6. Q: How do I get from course to course on Kiawah; and from lodging to course on Kiawah?
 - A: Kiawah On-Island Transportation Shuttle Vans. To call a shuttle, simply walk out to the Sanctuary Front Drive (Bell Stand) and request a shuttle OR use the speed dial button on your villa/guestroom phone "on-island transportation" and you will be connected with the Transportation Supervisor who will dispatch vehicle(s) to your location. Give a 10-20 minute lead time.
- 7. **Q:** Are Villas close to the Sanctuary?
 - A: We chose the closest villas possible to the Sanctuary. They are adjacent to the Kiawah Roy Barth Tennis Courts. Walkable up to the Sanctuary; 5-10min walk, or quick shuttle.
- 8. Q: What is main hang at Kiawah, off the course?
 - A: The Ponce hub will likely be the Lobby Bar at the Sanctuary. Great spot. They tend to close earlier than folks want it to, but sometimes you can buy more time.
- 9. **Q:** Our Kiawah dinners seem casual / 19th hole on both Saturday and Sunday nights. What if I want something more upscale / post-shower / 9:00pm type seating?
 - A: Since Friday and Monday will be more formal, and we are squeezing a lot of golf at both ends, we opted for casual Sat & Sun dinner options. Plus, Sunday at Ocean Course will be scenic/epic. That said, if you want that steak/claret experience at Kiawah, by all means seek a small group and divert to <u>The Ocean Room</u> at the Sanctuary, or <u>The Atlantic Room</u> at the Ocean Course Clubhouse.

- **10. Q:** Kiawah has a Spa in the Sanctuary and indoor and outdoor pools at the Sanctuary. Can I hit those?
 - A: By all means, yes! Wherever you can squeeze it in, depending on your tee times (it will be tight though and after all this is first and foremost a golf tournament). Pro tip: For Ocean on Sunday, I recommend giving the shuttle 25 mins to drive you out there. If it is warm on Sunday, pack a swimsuit for quick ocean dip during one of the rare Masters commercials on CBS.
- **11. Q:** If I drive to the Ponce, where do I leave my car?
 - A: There is a covered parking garage adjacent to the Francis Marion downtown. Best to park there and retrieve it on Tuesday. We are not permitting any Poncer to drive out to Kiawah on Friday night. If you are playing the Friday practice round at Yeamans, you can drive your car and leave it out there (take group transport / uber to Opening Ceremonies) and leave car at YHC until Tuesday morning.
- **12. Q**: Do I need cash?

A:

- A: Gratuity on-hand for Kiawah & YHC staff is smart. Also Ocean caddie (typically approx. \$100USD per bag). We also may need to "pass the hat" a few times for incidentals. Ponce charity is individually made online / credit card / tax-deductible.
